This presentation focuses mainly on routine and emergency communications in the blue box, but touches on all boxes.

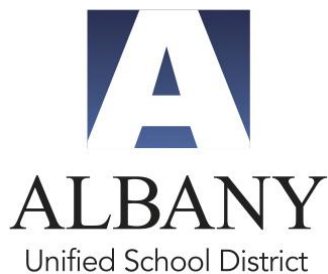
What Tools Do We Use To Communicate?

The first and best way to communicate is face to face, in person!

This is important to remember.

Tools:

- **AUSD Gmail**
- **Google Classroom** (teacher–student)
- **Language Line** (a live translator for communicating with non-English speaking parents/guardians)
- **ParentSquare (PSq)**
 - **Broadcast District-wide and school-wide messages, as well as updates and announcements between regular communications**
 - **Classroom newsletters and announcements** (teachers and Room Parents)
 - **Absence and tardy auto-notices**
 - **Emergency and Non-emergency Alerts** (via text message)
 - **Direct Messages** (within PSq, individual conversations, usually between teachers and parents/guardians)

AUSD's communications software is Aeries Communications Powered By ParentSquare

- This is AUSD's third year using ParentSquare (PSq).
- No outside vendor means that all student and adult information remains secure in our Student Information System.
- Information is synchronized nightly.
- Parents/guardians receive emails in the language listed in Aeries as their home language.
- ALL parents/guardians receive emails/texts from PSq. **No registration is required.**
- Registration allows you to:
 - select a language for communications,
 - choose between email and text notifications, or get both, and
 - receive messages instantly or in a daily digest.

Direct Messages are like text messages, but within the PSq app:

- * Usually from a teacher to a student's parents about a particular issue or accomplishment
- * Parents can respond within the app

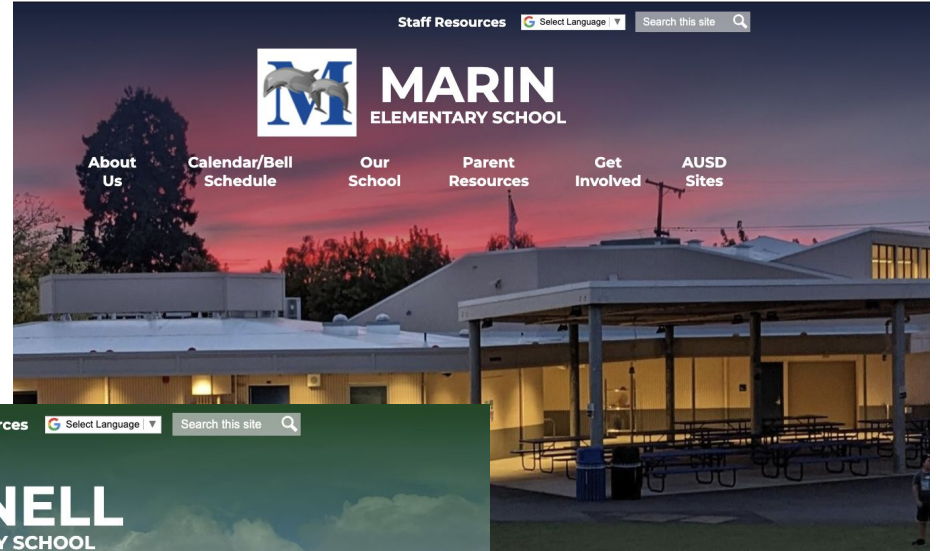
Clever Ways To Use PSq

Non-Emergency Alerts: Principals can send a single text message simultaneously to all staff. This is useful for daytime announcements, when teachers are more likely to glance at their phones and may not have time to check emails.

Non-emergency, but urgent text messages, can also be sent to parents. For example, if a street adjoining a school is closed, parents can be alerted.

Direct Messages: Because of the translation features built into PSq, teachers can communicate through Direct Messages with non-English speaking parents about student-specific issues in a conversational way. Messages are automatically translated in both directions.

NOTICE FOR VISITORS

All people entering the building as visitors during normal daily business hours must have an appointment and check in at the front desk with an I.D. A visitor is defined as a non-employee or contractor of the district. All visitors must be accompanied by an escort through the building to their appointment destination. Unescorted members of the public must remain in the front desk area of the office. Due to the confidential information related to students and staff, no video recording, still photography, or voice recording shall take place beyond the front desk unless there is a scheduled time, place, and venue that will not expose confidential information.

New Marin Elementary School Is Opening!

MARIN OPEN HOUSE-SAVE THE DATE!

The Marin Elementary School Grand Re-Opening and Ribbon Cutting will be on Friday, August 11 from 1-7pm. Twenty-four spectators, well-Rt, and go-to-date classrooms were built, while the multipurpose room, administrative pod, and library were renovated. The playground has greatly increased in size, with new nature-play areas, ball fields, and a terrific new play structure. Everyone is invited, please come and explore the marvellous new school and playground that were built with your bond dollar!

EXCITING CHANGES NOW FULLY REALIZED

All major facilities projects funded by School Bond Measures B&E are now complete. Marin Elementary's re-opening ends four years of temporary housing with Ocean View and Main students on-site at AMS and AIS. For the coming school year, the AMS Annex will house eighth grade classrooms, plus world languages, computer science, theatre, and choir. AIS will gain classrooms and install a new Design/Build workshop in the Church Addition. Temporary classrooms at both sites will be removed.

Cornell Improvements

While the original Cornell Elementary building continues to serve students and host a vibrant school community, numerous recent improvements keep it up to date. Technology upgrades provide teachers and students with the same capabilities as their peer schools. This summer, new paint will brighten the exterior, and a second phase of playground renovation will add ball walls, a whiffy, and the newest play structure in Albany. Plans are proceeding for a heating and air conditioning (HVAC) system, along with electrical upgrades. Cornell now has a greener, all-electric kitchen from recent renovations. Because Cornell was determined to be seismically sound in engineering analysis, AJUSD seeks to moderate and continue to improve this California Distinguished School.



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
